









### I need quiet time once a day.




Some kids take a nap. Some kids look at a book. Some kids do a quiet activity.





## Is your child ready for Kindergarten?

Kindergarten teachers and child development experts suggest that a new kindergartener should:

- Know her first and last names and her parents' first and last names.
- Recognize letters (lowercase and uppercase) and numbers (up to 10).
- **:** Know basic colors and shapes.
- Use the bathroom and wash his hands all by himself.
- Solve problems without hitting, biting, or yelling.
- Follow instructions from teachers and parents.
- Communicate wants and needs (hunger, pain, confusion) through words.
- Be comfortable being apart from her parents during the school day.
- Sit quietly for short periods of time.
- Be curious and interested in activities like story and art time.
